

AIM

Our aim is to engage the children in a fun and interactive program to give them an understanding of what a generous God we have, some of the amazing programs run by The Salvation Army and how we can help support these programs through the Self Denial Appeal.

This program is suitable for children 5-11 years of age. It is designed to support children's workers by providing easy-to-do, fun resources to encourage children to follow Jesus' example of living generously.

The material is presented through the Self Denial booklet, featuring the Kidzone characters, and short videos which will present weekly lessons and activities. To familiarise your class with the characters, give them copies of Kidzone magazine or visit the Kidzone website at https://www.kidzonemag.com.au. The characters are on the home page; click on the characters' faces for their profiles.

HOW IT WORKS

Each week the booklet provides a comic featuring the Kidzone characters to explain the Self Denial Appeal and The Salvation Army programs in Malawi, Sri Lanka, Rwanda and Fiji. This complements the material presented in the videos.

This year's theme for the Self Denial Appeal is 'Motivated by Love'. Throughout the six weeks of the program, the children will get to know about Malawi, Sri Lanka, Rwanda and Fiji through crafts, recipes and activities provided in the booklet.

They will also watch short videos profiling the work of The Salvation Army in these countries and be encouraged to raise money to support these projects. Each child will be given a Self Denial Appeal money box to make, which they can then use to collect the money they have raised.

At the end of the six-week program, the children will be invited to bring in their money box





to give the money they have raised to support the people helped by Self Denial Appeal programs around the world.



SET UP:

Set up a table with Self Denial Appeal money box sheets and coloured pencils or felt-tipped pens ready for the children to make during the session. Have a large sheet of paper available to write down ideas for raising money to put into their boxes over the next six weeks.

INTRODUCTION (5 mins)

Start the session by reading pages 2-3.

POINT out Shushanna's photo on page 3 and read her introduction on page 2.



READ the memory verse next to Cousin Koala.




LOOK through the 'Motivated by Love' comic on pages 4 and 5.



VIDEO (3 mins)

► WATCH Shushanna introduce the SDA programs in Malawi, Sir Lanka, Rwanda and Fiji and the reason we raise money to help others. The video ends with the suggestion to share fundraising ideas, so move the children to the table set up with paper and the money boxes.

CRAFT (10-12 mins)





O CHAT about fundraising ideas with a brainstorming session about how they could raise money, as suggested in the video. What are some chores they could do (e.g. weeding, washing cars) or what sort of treats could they skip to give that money to the appeal instead? Perhaps your class

could think of something to sell to your corps as a special SDA money raiser, such as icing cupcakes or biscuits for morning tea? Write their ideas on the paper and keep it to refer to in the coming weeks.

MEMORY VERSE (3 mins)

READ out the memory verse on page 2, 1 Corinthians chapter 16, verses 13-14, together.



BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

Even giving a little can have a huge impact, such as the young boy who gave Jesus his lunch – which was used to miraculously feed thousands of people (Matthew 14:13-21). This story shows how children's giving can make a difference.

Jesus also honours generous giving, even when what is offered doesn't seem like much. Luke 21:1-4 tells us: 'Jesus looked up and saw some rich people putting their gifts to God into the Temple collection box. Then he saw a poor widow put two small copper coins into the box. He said, "This poor widow gave only two small coins. But the truth is, she gave more than all those rich people. They have plenty, and they gave only what they did not need. This woman is very poor, but she gave all she had to live on."



BEFORE YOUR CLASS

MAKE: To make the mbatata on page 8 in class you will need to pre-prepare the sweet potato dough. Take disposable plates, flour to dust the plates and rolling pins and cookie cutters



for the children to use to make their cookies. You will need to have access to an oven to bake them; an air fryer could also be used.

INTRODUCTION (5-7 mins)

Malawi is our first stop for the Self Denial Appeal 2026, so let's find out about this nation.

READ out or invite some of your class to read out Traveller's column on page 7 to learn some facts about Malawi.



Traveller is Kidzone's jet-setting character who will be giving us lots of information about the countries featured in the Self Denial Appeal.

READ the comic on page 6 with Oliver & CK.



READ the column on page 7 about Mercy and a Salvation Army program that helps girls like her stay in school.



VIDEO (3 mins)

WATCH Shushanna as she tells the class about how the program and how it has helped girls stay in school and get an education.

COOKING (10-12 mins)

GIVE each child a piece of mbatata dough on a plate sprinkled with flour. Follow the recipe from steps 6-8 (page 8). When the cookies are baked

and cooled, you can enjoy eating them together or the children could take them home.





CHAT about what your class has done to raise money to put into their Self Denial money boxes. Bring out last week's brainstorming sheet - did anyone try any of these? Does anyone have other ideas to add?

READ out the memory verse on page 3 together.



BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

Girls are important to God. In Bible times (like some countries still today), girls often didn't go to school or have the opportunity to learn from teachers like Jesus. But Jesus wanted everyone to learn about God's kingdom. In the Bible we hear how he welcomed women like Mary and Martha to come and listen to him (Luke 10:38-42).

Chat about how Martha was working away while Mary sat and listened to Jesus, and how it may have been unusual for Mary not to be busy serving Jesus and the disciples. Discuss how Jesus wanted them to learn about God and how he encouraged Mary - and Martha - to spend time listening to him.



BEFORE YOUR CLASS:

MAVE all the supplies you will need to make the water filter on page 12. This is a great activity for the children to watch or help you with some of the steps. Older children could do this experiment in pairs.



INTRODUCTION (5-7 mins)

This week, the Self Denial Appeal is focusing on Sri Lanka, so let's learn a bit about this nation on page 11 of our magazine with Traveller.

READ out or invite some of your class to read out Traveller's column.



LOOK at the comic on page 10 with CK & Faith.



READ the introduction on the left-hand column on page 11 to hear Rangana's story.



VIDEO (3 mins)

WATCH Shushanna tell us about Rangana and how The Salvation Army's filtration plants make a huge difference to people's lives.

ACTIVITY (10 mins)

MAKE the water filter on page 12.



READ the explanation on how the filter works and the Bible message on page 12.

DO the puzzles on page 13.



CHAT about what the kids have done to raise money to put into their Self Denial money boxes this week.

MEMORY VERSE (3 mins)

READ out the memory verse, 1 Corinthians 16:13-14, together. This is on page 3. Can anyone say it without looking at it?



BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

Water is essential for life. We found out this week how The Salvation Army's water filtration plants have made such a huge difference to people's lives.

Jesus knew that everyone needs water to live – just like we need him (living water) to have eternal life. Jesus explains this when he meets the woman at the well (John 4:1-14.)



BEFORE YOUR CLASS:

Set out the materials (straws and different coloured wool) you will need to make the straw loom bracelets on page 17.



INTRODUCTION (5 mins)

CHAT about what the kids have done to raise money to put into their Self Denial money boxes this week.

This week, the Self Denial Appeal is focusing on Rwanda, so let's learn a bit about this nation on page 15 of our magazine with Traveller.

READ or invite one of the children to read Traveller's column (page 15) to the rest of the class



LOOK at the comic on page 14 with CK & Jym.



READ the introduction on the left-hand column on page 15 to hear Pascal's story.



VIDEO (3 mins)

WATCH the video to hear about Pascal and how he trained to be a mechanic at The Salvation Army college.

ACTIVITY (10-12 minutes)

MAKE the straw loom bracelets on page 17.



READ the message at the bottom of page 17.

DO the puzzles on page 16.



MEMORY VERSE (3 mins)


READ out the memory verse, 1 Corinthians 16:13-14, together. This is on page 3. Can anyone say it without looking at it?



BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

It's important to do God's work and we have heard how The Salvation Army's college is doing God's work by educating people to so that they can have a bright future by having a job so they can earn money to live. The Bible talks about working - "In all the work you are doing, work the best you can. Work as if you were working for the Lord, not for men." (Colossians 3:23)

TALK about some people in the Bible who worked hard at their jobs - David (shepherd), Joseph (carpenter) and the disciples – what was the job many of them had? Remind the children of the time Jesus visited them on the beach after his resurrection (John 21: 1-13).



INTRODUCTION (5-7 mins)

This week, the Self Denial Appeal is focusing on Fiji so let's learn a bit about this nation with Traveller on page 19 of our magazine.

READ or invite one of the children to read Traveller's column (page 19) to the rest of the class.



READ the comic on page 18 with CK & Traveller.



READ the introduction on the left-hand column on page 19 to hear Amani's story.



VIDEO (3 mins)

D WATCH Shushanna tell us about Amani and how he was helped by The Salvation Army's as a teenager and now helps boys who have nowhere safe to live.

ACTIVITY (10 mins)

BRING out the barfi in the slice tray and show the children the recipe on page 21 so they can see how you made it. Cut the barfi into pieces and enjoy tasting it.



DO the puzzles on page 20.



CHAT about what the kids have done to raise money to put into their Self Denial money boxes this week.



MEMORY VERSE (3 mins)

READ out the memory verse, 1 Corinthians 16:13-14, together. This is on page 3. Can anyone say it without looking at it?




BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

There are many Bible stories about God keeping people safe, such as in storms and during famines. When Jonah was thrown overboard during a storm, God sent a huge fish to swallow him so he wouldn't drown (Jonah chapters 1-2). When Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt, God kept them safe crossing the Red Sea (Exodus 14:13-22).

Jesus kept his disciples safe during a storm (Mark 4:35-41).

The prophet Elisha miraculously provided food to a widow and her son in Zarephath with an unending supply of flour and oil, keeping them safe by being fed during a time when there was no food available (1 Kings 17:7-15).

READ the introduction on page 23.



VIDEO (5 mins)

► WATCH Shushanna wrap up the Self Denial Appeal program.

CHAT with your class about some of the things they have learned about these countries and the SDA programs.

(Prompts: capital cities, animals, food, climate, flag colours)

WRAP-UP (8-10 mins)

READ the comic on page 22 with CK and the Kidzone gang.



COLLECT the children's money boxes.



CHAT about how they earned the money they put in their boxes and how they feel knowing that this money is going to help others in need around the world. What was their favourite way of raising money for the appeal?

READ out the memory verse on page 3. Has anyone memorised it?



DO the word search on page 23.



DO the colouring on page 24.



BIBLE STORY EXTENSION:

Everything The Salvation Army does is motivated by the love of God to help people around the world. And everything Jesus did when he was on Earth was motivated by love, such as healing people: the man who was paralysed (Luke 5:18-25), blind man (Mark 8:22-26), Jairus' daughter (Luke 8:43-48), but especially when he died on the cross for our sins, so that we could have eternal life (John 3:16).
